



Freedom from Oppression II

Prerequisite: This course is a continuation of “Freedom from Oppression I”

Course description: This is a deeper dive into the origins of the concepts of the connection between inner healing and deliverance. These concepts have been developed by different seasoned ministries and have been found to be effective. You, the student, will learn the origins of the various aspects. By understanding the precepts, you can develop your own method.

The Holy Spirit wants us to help the broken and the prisoners as outlined in Isaiah 61. Understanding these concepts will lead to more effective ministry. Much of what we know about the demonic is shrouded in superstition and myth. Developing a biblical approach that incorporates inner healing and deliverance will add a valuable tool to your ministry.

1. The origins of this method of deliverance and it's theological foundations.
2. Helping the person see the issues by gathering pertinent information.
 - A. Utilizing the gifts of the holy Spirit
 - B. Formatting the information gathered in that process.

 - A. Witchcraft is a very real and present danger for the church today. Children are being groomed for Satan's purposes.
 - B. These cases are a little more complex. Victims of SRA are groomed by creating trauma.
 - C. Alters (created disassociations) are utilized for specific tasks.
- 6. Mental illness and deliverance
- 7. Deliverance and physical healing
- 8. Follow up procedures.
- 9. Common questions answered.
- 10. Does this ministry require a special calling?
- 11. Grading will be based on the lab. This class will be tailored to the needs and experience of the student. The student will spend time each week on the phone with the instructor.
